Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to:

- establish an environment where amateur radio operators utilize their operating privileges and interact with other current and potential amateur radio operators in a positive, welcoming, and ethical manner;
- ensure members provide positive support of the Coppell Amateur Radio Enthusiasts' objectives and purposes; and
- maintain a positive relationship with the City of Coppell, area organizations, and others whom Coppell Amateur Radio Enthusiasts supports through use of amateur radio.

Overview

Coppell Amateur Radio Enthusiasts desires to foster an amateur radio community willing and able to help in times of need and also mentor and Elmer upcoming and current amateur radio operators in the art in a courteous, helpful, and supportive manner. To help ensure communications and support in a manner that supports our objectives and purposes, we expect all members to adhere to the code of conduct.

Should we receive a complaint or other such feedback regarding a member's conduct, either on or off the air, we will review for potential violations of this code of conduct and should the conduct be determined to be materially and seriously prejudicial or egregious we will terminate the membership in accordance with our bylaws.

Coppell Amateur Radio Enthusiasts reviews all membership applications prior to approval to review applicants' reputation, and applicants found to not hold positive reputation or to follow appropriate operating practices in accordance with the code of conduct will not be permitted to join.

Code of Conduct

By joining Coppell Amateur Radio Enthusiasts, members agree to:

1. uphold the objectives and principles of Coppell Amateur Radio Enthusiasts;
2. maintain positive reputation in the amateur radio community, both on and off the air;
3. maintain positive reputation in the Coppell community and surrounding communities;
4. follow Federal Communications Commission rules when operating an amateur radio station; and
5. exhibit positive operating practices such as outlined in the International Amateur Radio Union's Ethics and Operating Procedures for the Radio Amateur, Edition 3 (June 2010) authored for IARU Region 2.
